This Cookie Statement explains how Project 1972, Inc. (d/b/a/ Chief) and our subsidiaries and affiliates (collectively, "Chief", "we", "us", and "ours") use cookies and similar technologies to recognize you when you visit our websites at chief.com ("Websites"). It explains what these technologies are and why we use them, as well as your rights to control our use of them. What are cookies?

The Services use cookies and similar technologies such as pixel tags, web beacons, clear GIFs, mobile identifiers, and JavaScript (collectively, "Cookies") to enable our servers to recognize your web browser and tell us how and when you visit and use our Services. Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. Cookies are widely used by website owners in order to make their websites work, or to work more efficiently, as well as to provide reporting information. Cookies set by the website owner (in this case, Chief) are called "first party cookies". Cookies set by parties other than the website owner are called "third party cookies". Third party cookies enable third party features or functionality to be provided on or through the website (e.g. like advertising, interactive content and analytics). The parties that set these third party cookies can recognize your computer both when it visits the website in question and also when it visits certain other websites.

How do we use cookies and similar technologies?

The Services use Cookies to enable our servers to recognize your web browser and tell us how and when you visit and use our Services, to analyze trends, learn about our user base, and operate and improve our Services. For example, we use Cookies to tailor the Services by tracking navigation habits, measuring performance, customizing user experiences with the Services and for analytics and fraud prevention. We may also supplement the information we collect from you with information received from third parties, including information collected using Third Party Cookies.

We use the following types of Cookies:

Essential Cookies. Essential Cookies are required for providing you with features or services that you have requested. For example, certain Cookies enable you to log into secure areas of our Services. Disabling these Cookies may make certain features and services unavailable.

Functional Cookies. Functional Cookies are used to record your choices and settings regarding our Services, maintain your preferences over time and recognize you when you return to our

Services. These Cookies help us to personalize our content for you and remember your preferences.

Performance/Analytical Cookies. Performance/Analytical Cookies allow us to understand how visitors use our Services such as by collecting information about the number of visitors to the Services, what pages visitors view on our Services, how long visitors are viewing pages on the Services, mouse clicks, mouse movements, scrolling activity, and text typed into the Services. Performance/Analytical Cookies also help us measure the performance of our advertising campaigns in order to help us improve our campaigns and the Services' content for those who engage with our advertising. For example, Google Inc. ("Google") uses cookies in connection with its Google Analytics services. Google's ability to use and share information collected by Google Analytics about your visits to the Services is subject to the Google Analytics Terms of Use and the Google Privacy Policy. Retargeting/Advertising Cookies. Retargeting/Advertising Cookies collect information about your browsing habits in order to make advertising relevant to you and your interests. They remember the websites you have visited and that information is shared with other parties such as advertising technology service providers and advertisers.

ajs_anonymous_id	Segment.io	This cookie is used to identify a specific visitor - this information is used to identify the number of specific visitors on a website.	1 Year
ajs_anonymous_id	Chief	This cookie is used to count how many times a website has been visited by different visitors - this is done by assigning the visitor an ID, so the visitor does not get registered twice.	Persistent
AnalyticsSync History	LinkedIn	This cookie is used in connection with data-synchronization with third-party analytics service.	30 Days
Plogger	Parse.ly	Collects data on the user's navigation and behavior on the website. This is used to compile statistical reports and heatmaps for the website owner.	Session

bcookie	LinkedIn	This cookie is used by the social networking service, LinkedIn, for tracking the use of embedded services.	2 Years
lang	LinkedIn	This cookie is used by LinkedIn when a webpage contains an embedded "Follow us" panel.	Session
lidc	LinkedIn	This cookie is used by the social networking service, LinkedIn, for tracking the use of embedded services.	1 Day
UserMatchHistory	LinkedIn	This cookie ensures visitor browsing-security by preventing cross-site request forgery. This cookie is essential for the security of the website and visitor.	30 Days

How can I control cookies and other technologies?

You have rights and controls when it comes to managing cookies. Some cookies are essential and we cannot provide our service to you without them, but there are others that can be turned off. Please note that turning off certain cookies will disable some of the features available to you. Therefore, we cannot guarantee that your experience will be as good as it could otherwise be.

Browser Controls: You can decide whether or not to accept Cookies through your internet browser's settings.
